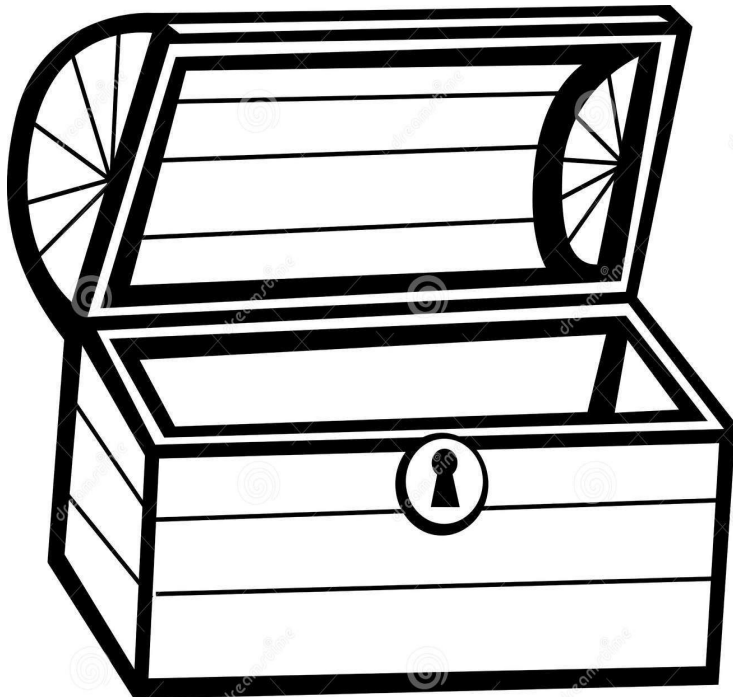


What's in the box?

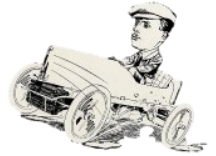
You can find this chest and discover what it held if you go upstairs.
