





Secretary's Report

This report marks the completion of the third year of the previous LAF from its meeting on 3 May 2023 to its last meeting on 9 November 2023 and the agreed forward work programme for the new forum.

The forum has continued to operate with membership above the statutory minimum. The appointing authority's representative changed as a result of changes to the Council's cabinet in Autumn 2023. Councillor Sara Burch replaced Councillor Ben Callard as the authority's nominated representative on the forum.


Meetings were held face to face in accordance with the local access forum regulations

Meetings were held on 3 May 2023, 11 July 2023 and 9 November 2023, with public agendas available on the Council's web site. The 3-year period of appointment expired at the end of November and the Council started to make arrangements for the appointment of a new forum leading to the appointment of new members on 29 February 2024.

The LAF members continued to contribute to the resolution and development of countryside access issues and policy in Monmouthshire. We are very grateful for their voluntary input and for the experience and advice they provide and their commitment to the work of the forum.

The forum has been supported through the continuing commitment of officers from Natural Resource Wales, and across countryside access, highway, and legal teams with Monmouthshire County Council.

The Year reviewed

These are some of the issues where the LAF have advised and been consulted: -

1. Countryside Access Improvement Plan

The forum has received updates on progress in implementing the Countryside Access Improvement Plan (CAIP) including partnership arrangements, grant / project delivery and community engagement. The LAF received an update on the proposed changes to display various legal registers and temporary closures within CAMS / the public interactive mapping system.

The forum discussed and received presentations on the Lower Wye Valley Tracks and Trails project (previously referred to as the Lower Wye Valley Integrated Recreational Access Strategy). The Strategy considers ways both to better manage the natural resources of the National Landscape (AONB) and also those that enjoy it, responding to the opportunity to support the tracks and trails network to address issues regarding the use and condition of the countryside access network with the National Landscape. Members supported the need to address these issues

2. Natural Resources Wales


Natural Resources Wales have provided regular updates on land management and forestry operations of interest to the forum and any changes in recreational policy. The forum has appreciated this approach and the information provided and questions answered.

3. Consultations

The forum members considered the consultation on the draft Public Space Protection Orders on Dog Controls in Monmouthshire. Members raised questions around the proposed order including how they related to unfenced sports pitches and play areas and a concern restriction could result in forcing more dog walking out into the surrounding countryside.


Members discussed the proposed revision of the local access forum regulations which had been included in the topics at the LAF Chairs meeting. The suggestion that members should be limited to one 3-year term of office, had proved controversial and was opposed by the Chair's meeting. Members continue to be in favour of practical changes to the administration and holding of future meetings, including allowing hybrid meetings, electronic communication etc.

Members received an update on Active Travel proposals including the proposals at Castle Meadows Abergavenny.

Future Work Programme

The future work programme for the new forum was discussed and agreed at the 11 June 2024 meeting and is appended (Appendix 2).

Role of the Forum

The Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 requires local authorities and National Parks, to establish Local Access Forums (LAFs). These forums advise Natural Resources Wales (NRW), local authorities and National Park authorities on ways in which local access can be improved.

The statutory purpose of LAFs is to advise on the improvement of public access to land for the purposes of open-air recreation and enjoyment of the area in which they are established. LAF's must have regard to the needs of land management, natural beauty, flora, fauna, and geological and physiographical features.

The following bodies must have regard to any relevant advice given by the LAF: National Park authority, the highway authority, Natural Resources Wales, Welsh Government and, for matters relating to defence or security, the Secretary of State.

The forums must have a balance between:

- Users of access land and local rights of way; and
- Landowners and occupiers of access land and land with rights of way.


People with other interests especially relevant to the area will also be represented.

The Regulations specify there should be between 12 and 22 members, including the Chair and the Deputy. In addition, the Chair may invite other individuals and organisations to observe and give advice.

Members are appointed by the Appointing Authority the local Highway Authority or National Park Authority. Monmouthshire County Council is the appointing authority for the Monmouthshire LAF which covers the administrative County of Monmouthshire outside the boundary of the Brecon Beacons National Park. It includes the Wye Valley National Landscape (Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty) within the county.

Within the area there are Registered Commons and 1657 Kilometres of registered Public Rights of Way. There is in addition a substantial length of County Unclassified Roads, the responsibility of the Highway Section, many of which are un-surfaced.

Monmouthshire County Council and the Brecon Beacons National Park Authority have a Delegated Responsibility Agreement covering most aspects of the management of Public Rights of Way within the National Park.






